Organization Experience:

Agriculture promotion:

CFP Program: NRML-MGNREGS CFT Convergence project is part of initiative taken by MoRD to strengthen the MGNREGA planning and implementation processes through regular handholding support to community and government by deploying the Cluster Facilitation team at Panchayat Level. Multi Art Association in agreement with Rural Development Department, Government of Jharkhand, is facilitated the CFP program in Block of Latehar, Lohardaga Districts of Jharkhand, which aims to strengthen the implementation of the MGNREGAS program through critical facilitation and capacity buildings roles at the grassroots-strategically mobilizing CBOs (SHG Collectives) and Gram Panchayats, by performing as a technical secretariat to the selected Gram Panchayats by employing a team of staff under the CFP project.

Intervention for Child Rights: The organization is working with CHILD LINE INDIA FOUNDATION since December 2020. 1098 (24x7), Child-line Collab, is being conducted by the organization in Latehar district of Jharkhand. The care and protection of children of 0 to 18 years of this program, against child labor and child trafficking, along with awareness on issues like child marriage, human trafficking, missing, orphaned children, rescue and home verification and Restoration. Child Line 1098 Service Team Member working with the district administration and CWC (child Welfare Comities). This program is supported by the Child Line India Foundation and the Ministry of Women and Child Development, Government of India. Through this program the organization has reached 804 children in distress and supported them through various activities. 326 children were linked to Govt. sponsored schemes, 101 children were mainstreamed to education, 104 Missing and runaway children were tracked and brought back to home, 39 child labour were rescued, 15 child marriage were stopped, 56 children affected by COVID were helped in getting AADHAR, caste certificate, disability certificate, 48 Trafficking cases were registered and action was taken by local administration, 31 Children were supported for treatment, 26 Street children were rehabilitated, other than his 32 cases of sexual abuse, 19 cases of physical and emotional abuse, 2 cases of drug addition, 5 cases of restoration were resolved in association with CWC. Open house such as interaction with school children, teachers, parents meeting, mother meeting, meeting with SHG, awareness camp, distribution of IEC materials, meeting with Polish Department, outreach program, counselling were carried out in this context.

Gram Swashasan Abhiyan: Gram Swashasan Abhiyan is started at Palamu sub division level by network partner Multi Art Association, Vedic Society, Vikas Sahyog Kendra, Mahila Samagra Utthan Samiti to strengthen Gram Sabha and traditional practices in schedule area so that they may access their rights of Gram sabha and participate in planning, implementation and monitoring of all social security schemes and village development. The campaign will be spread in Santhal Pargana and Kolhan region by network partner. The campaign is supported by Azim Premji Foundation. The objectives of this campaign are to establish Gram Sabha a model at state and national level which can be replicated in other areas.

Strengthening Gram Sabha and Self governance: The organisation believes that implementation of PESA in schedule area is one of the major instruments of community empowerment through strengthening gram sabha. The organisation has worked continuously to aware community about the provisions of PESA and continuation of traditional practices in schedule areas.

NREGA Help Centre: The organisation has been working to ensure right to work of marginalised community of society through MNREGA. Through CFT project of rural development department it has tried to ensure smooth implementation and the monitoring of schemes in its area of operation in Manika and Barwadih block of Latehar. Besides the organization is also supporting community through NREGA help centre in these blocks which act as link between the administration and the NREGA workers which help in addressing their grievance. At present 13 NREGA Help centre is being run by Multi Art Association by support of UUHIP.

Forest Right Act: The organisation is also working to ensure the forest right of tribal community through gram sabha in Palamu, Latehar and Garhwa district. Organization is working on the forest right in the 22 villages of Bargarh block of Garhwa, 81 villages in Barwadih block of Latehar district and 81 villages in Manika block of Latehar district with the help of Global Greengrant Fund and Jharkhand Van Adhikar Manch where it has helped the tribal and other forest dwellers in claiming their community forest right It has also helped in the formation of Van Adhikar Samiti .It has helped in establishing community ownership over the minor forest produce which has increased the livelihood of the poor. 44 CFR and 1638 claim generated in Latehar and Garhwa block of Jharkhand and claims have been submitted in SDLC in Garhwa and Latehar district.

Right to Food: The organisation has been working continuously to ensure right to food of poor and marginalised through monitoring of implementation and creating awareness about the provisions of National Food Security Act 2013 in the operational areas. The organisation has also helped in policy intervention by building public pressure and helping research and study in the operational area.

Promotion of Livelihood: Organisation is also working to strengthen the livelihood of community. In CFT-MNREGA project it is working on mango plantation project. Along with mango plantation it is also working on intercropping. Organisation is also working to promote Lac production and seed village.

Women empowerment and gender equity: The organisation is also working towards women empowerment and gender equity. With AALI (Association for advocacy and legal initiative) the organisation is working for addressing women's issue through right based perspective. The organisation tries to provide legal aid to women, especially those from marginalised and deprived communities, who are victim of domestic violence, trafficking, witch hunting etc. Organisation has also worked for promotion of gender equity and women empowerment in Daltonganj through Young Women Leadership Program (YWLP) in association with FAT(Feminist Approach to Technology). In this project young girls from marginalised community were given training in Information technology. They were trained in operating computer and other software skill. Besides the project also involved various workshops and field work which gave the young women opportunity to learn the value of gender equity and understanding and dealing with patriarchy.

Relief work during COVID pandemic:

Relief work such as Ration, medicines and other essentials materials supply in korrentine center were supplied in Palamu, Garhwa and Latehar districts by support of Phia and APF during both phase of Corona pandemic. 100 % vaccination program was initiated by the support of PHIYA FOUNDATION and APF, vaccination campaign was organized with a view to achieve 100% vaccination in rural area of Ramgarh and Satbarwa blocks of Palamu district. Volunteers of MAA visited door to door and encouraged villagers for Covid-vaccination. Those who have taken first doze, they were appreciated for second doze and those who have not taken first doze were encouraged for first doze.
